


PRESIDENT ...

This year, again we had no loss of life between our flags. With 6460 patrolling hours by our members providing aquatic safety for our beachgoers. Patrols this year saved 3 lives, did 1342 preventative actions, treated 141 first aid incidents, gained 185 awards and over 22,000 people visited our beach, not a bad effort from a club with only 92 Active Lifesavers. Winning the Buhk Wilkes Trophy last year was another highlight in our history of this award and we strive to continue our dominance of core lifesaving skills at Marcoola SLSC.

SLSQ provided a membership snapshot which shows a worrying trend in membership retention given their volunteer commitments at a small club, hence the reason the Management Committee has decided to hold a Strategic Planning Conference in August on how to address issues such as these and plan our future growth. We successfully applied for a grant to cover most of the cost of the Planning Conference, we will be engaging with key stakeholders and members on how to make our members life easier when patrolling our beach and how to ensure we best cover our stretch of beach with smarter patrolling strategies. I cannot thank you all enough for your commitment and dedication to your local community and the bathing public. Thank you to all our Members and Staff.



TREASURER...

The 2016-17 financial year has been somewhat of a roller coaster ride for Marcoola SLSC. Following on from a record donation from the Supporters Club last year, we approached our budget for this year with high expectations. However, a general downturn in the Club industry has meant we weren't able to achieve the income level we expected.

Total income was well down on the previous period. Cash donations from the Supporters Club were \$370,000. Although this is significantly less than the 2015/16 figures, we have probably reached a more true average of \$450,000 over the two years. Our operating surplus for the year is a healthy \$325,000.

This financial year saw the finalisation of our loan with Bendigo Bank which leaves the Club debt free, which is a great feeling for me personally, having gone through 4 major borrowings over my time as Treasurer. We were also able to self-fund the upgrade to the Supporters Club bar area and have a healthy bank balance at the end of the financial year.

Thanks to our Youth Development, Junior Activities and Competitors for their efforts in fundraising to support their particular programs and costs. Raffles income netted over \$50,000 this year.

Thanks also go to all our Club sponsors. North Shore Realty and Bendigo Bank have continued their association with the Club, along with our local State member, Fiona Simpson. We have also welcomed on board Sekisui House and White's IGA this year and we look forward to a long association with these companies.

I would like to especially mention Lyn and Amanda for their fantastic dedication and professionalism in their roles overseeing the day to day operation of our Club. I also wish to express my thanks the Management Committee and officers, who under the leadership of President David McLean, provide countless hours of work for the Club. Thanks also to Craig Hunter-Smith, the Supporters Club committee and Cameron Meninga for their management of the "upstairs" operations.

Finally, thanks to all members for their ongoing commitment to the Club.

BUILDING COMMITTEE ...

The Building Committee have once again been active, upgrading the facilities of our club for the benefit of both members and guests:

- 1. Long overdue was the upgrade the Administration Offices. The intent of this work was to improve the workspaces of the Administrator's and Club Manager's offices and that of the Reception area. Included in the scope of this project:
 - Replacement of joinery units such as desks, storage cupboards and work benches.
 - Installation of a new data / phone cabling and data management system (file server)
 - Installation of new energy efficient lighting
 - Installation of new carpet
 - General painting throughout.
- 2. Upgrade of the Lounge and Bar area was undertaken to create a more comfortable space for members and patrons. The scope of works included the separation of the gaming area from the lounge area by way of a fixed partition and accompanying bench seat, the replacement and upgrading of loose furniture, installation of carpet throughout (which has also assisted with longstanding acoustic problems), cladding of the cool room, cladding of the columns, lighting upgrade and the creation of a more relaxed seating area at the top of the stairs.
- 3. Another longstanding issue that was addressed this year was the rectification of the roof leaks. Most notably seen along the bulkhead in the Bar / Lounge area. Remedial repairs by a specialist contractor were carried out
- 4. The upgrade of the member's bathrooms (downstairs) was another project carried out during the year. Financially assisted by funds secured through a grant, the upgrade works have modernised our bathrooms.....new finishes and fixtures have created a much needed facelift to this facility.

Once again, the input of Dave McLean, George Hanson and Peter Ward have contributed immensely to the successful outcome of the above projects.

Marcoola SLSC ERG Members responded to several incidents after hours at the request of the SLSQ Tasking Officer. This year 140 calls have been received across the state with the majority of these by the Sunshine Coast for emergency assistance from Police, Fire, Ambulance and Other Agencies. Our Members have shown their value and benefit in such emergencies as well as on land and not just in the surf. Many of our members have again offered their assistance and been on call both within our area and outside our club and district.

July saw our Duty Officers tasked to Noosa River Mouth at midnight after a call from Police about a yacht drifting in the Noosa River. Police could not make contact with the person on Board. Duty Officer coordinated Noosa and Sunshine Beach crews who were launching jet skis when Coast Guard managed to wake the owner and attach a tow line and tow the yacht to safety.

September Duty Officer, Brian Goulding was tasked to a capsized boat in the Noosa River after calls to the after-hours phone by Police and organised Noosa SLSC to investigate. All persons found to be accounted for.

October saw members tasked to Marcoola for a missing Kite Surfer. A short searched revealed he had made it back to shore.

December saw members Dave McLean and Byron Mills tasked to Point Perry along with Coolum SLSC ERG and RWC 17. There were reports of a kayaker who was observed waving his paddle in distress. After searches were conducted with Police and QAS they eventually located the kayaker walking back to his car who had ended up way past his anticipated return point.

February saw Duty Officers tasked to Sunshine Beach after completing night training at Noosa for a reported flare sighting from a 000 call to Police. Duty Officers attended the location and had good visibility and along with the return on Lifesaver 46 Helicopter from night training deemed it to be a false alarm as nothing could be located. Our ERG was also tasked to Mudjimba Island for a missing Stand Up Paddle Boarder but the person was located prior to our arrival.

April saw our ERG tasked to a near drowning at Yaroomba. An international male tourist had got caught in a rip and Police were receiving multiple 000 calls. When we arrived QAS were on scene treating the patient who was in an altered state of consciousness and had ingested a lot of water. The man had been rescued by a bystander. The tourist was extremely lucky the passer-by was there and despite the calm conditions still managed to get caught in a strong rip.

June saw Brian Goulding, Joe Goulding and Dave McLean respond to a call for a Jet Ski washed up on the beach at beach access near Surfair with no ride apparent. Despite the urgency of the call when we arrived we located the rider who had broken down. Assistance was called from his friends to come and retrieve the ski and rider and return him home.

The severe weather events of Tropical Cyclone Debbie also saw our members placed on standby for Disaster Management call-outs. Many members volunteered to be on standby for flood relief and rescue work when asked by the Local Disaster Management Group and SLSQ Officers. We were fortunate with only some of our Duty Officers having to attend the LDMG Meetings as Liaison Officers, however SLSQ did get called upon at Logan and the Gold Coast for several rescues and a body retrieval.

The above call outs are a timely reminder of the inherent dangers of the ocean and of our need for Vigilance and Service at all times. We commend our members who go above and beyond their normal call of duty to provide this vale added assistance and lifesaving service for Surf Life Saving Queensland and the general public.




SUPPORTERS CLUB TREASURER ...

In what has been a successful year for our Supporters Club our donations were down substantially compared to last year. The \$500,000 donation last year was certainly a milestone and the best we have ever been able to achieve. It may also have proven that we perhaps pushed a little too hard and left ourselves little room for economic downturn and a few other issues. There was also a significant decrease in gaming revenue which may be attributed to the downturn in the mining and other sectors affecting patronage. Our donation of \$370,000 was still a great effort by our Manager Cameron Meninga and our staff to achieve such a profit.

When taken across a 2 year window the combined donations equate to \$870,000 or \$435,000 per year so a good result when annualised. Final audited figures show \$370,000.00 in cash donations down to our Surf Life Saving Club. These funds allow our Surf Life Saving Club to continue its vital rescue service on the beach and hopefully expand it to those areas not currently being serviced. The funds have allowed our loan to be paid down to Nil and have allowed for investment in areas not previously able to be done due to funding. It has also allowed us to pay for the club revamp and renovation without any borrowings and to finance capital gear and equipment purchases for the Supporters Club without external borrowings or interest costs. These amounts are reimbursed weekly & monthly from operational revenue.


The revamp of the club lounge area, the bar counter and gaming room along with new furniture have given a more welcoming and inviting feel to patrons and visitors alike. We are always working on ways to increase patronage amongst some stiff local competition.

Our audits have been completed and we have compared well against our competitors and other service providers. Thanks to Cameron and his team for keeping an eye on the expenditure and ensuring we have complied with all the statutory requirements. Our Bar gross profit was up on last year by nearly 3% and Bistro was up just over 8% Keno was down -3%, Gaming down by nearly -6%. Our Bar GP is better than the industry standard.



A continuing review of our gaming machines to keep them up to date has seen several game changes and the introduction of the new "Lightning Link" and some new machines with the latest technology has our gaming operations performing better than most of our peers however upgrades to other venues, changes in player behaviour and economic times all took a toll on our gaming operations. We recently upgraded our gaming room with a repaint, added a coffee machine and added a new acoustic wall delivering patron comfort to both gaming and other club visitors.





The function rooms are available for all members to hire out and you will be sure to be looked after. The Active Lifesaver Discount and Points reward system together with Social member discounts are offered by the club to reward our social members and those members who provide our vital lifesaving service. We urge you to take advantage of these initiatives.

Membership subscriptions are up on last year's figures and I would like to express a special thanks to all of our staff who have worked diligently during the year to help us achieve all of these results.

My thanks also go to the committee that I have worked with upstairs. These guys put in a lot of voluntary hours and the club should recognise this, Craig Hunter-Smith, George Hanson, Peter Ward, Richard Phillips, Peter Roulston and Ian Hunter. My thanks also to Cameron Meninga & Kerri Smith. Special thanks to Surf Club Treasurer Brian Goulding for being easy to work with and get along with and also to Lyn Mathison who always keeps the whole place on the straight and narrow. My thanks to Craig Hunter-Smith who has a wealth of knowledge in these areas but also puts in a big effort to meet regularly with our Manager and analyse all departments constantly looking for areas of improvement.

Remember the Supporters Club facility is a fund raising arm for the Surf Rescue work done by our volunteers downstairs who may one day have to risk their life to save someone. Please remember the importance and priority of our Rescue Service and remember this next time the committee or staff might not have everything exactly right. My thanks to all the past members, our valued patrons and committee's for their valuable contribution to our club.
