

#### From the President - Peter Hourn

Well, another challenging year is behind us with Covid related issues impacting at various times during the season. While this has made life more difficult, it is pleasing to see that the club continued to function as normally as possible and once again no preventable deaths on our patrolled beach. A very big thank you to all patrolling members who continue to put in numerous hours to keep our beach safe. The statistics for the season bear out just how big a commitment this is:

- Rescues: 17
- Preventative Actions: 273
- First Aid Treatments: 54
- Beach Visitations: 30,051
- Hours Patrolled: 7837

A special mention and huge thank you to Club Captain Rob "Jenko" Jenkins for the time and effort he has put into the club over the last couple of years. Jenko will be stepping down this year but will not be lost as he takes on the role of Volunteer Officer so we will all still see plenty of Jenko around the club. Once again thank you for your efforts over the last couple of seasons.

It has been a very busy year for the club, not the least of which was the number of new Bronze members that have been put through. This is a great sign going forward and I would like to welcome every one of the new members and look forward to seeing you all for years to come patrolling on the beach. Of course, this would not be possible without the efforts of our trainers and assessors led by Chief Training Officer, Riley Palmer. These trainers & assessors not only conduct the Bronze course but numerous other courses through the year to keep us all up to date and proficient.

This year saw our Nippers sign on in record numbers and despite the Covid regulations it was a very successful year. The amount of work that went on before and after Nippers, each Sunday was extraordinary. I would like to thank Amanda Janssen, Andrew Cullity and their team who made all this possible. This was on top of the usual running of the Nippers program during the morning which required large numbers of water safety, coaches, team managers and numerous other volunteers to make it happen.

The youth had a big year, thank you to Alaina Schmidt for coordinating activities culminating in winning the Sunshine Coast Club Spirit Award at the Youth Ball held at the beginning of May. We look forward to the youth developing and growing through the ranks of the club. I would also like to thank Geoff Jeffcoat who appeared to be everywhere throughout the season, helping with among other things, the youth, training, and doing inspections of the patrols.

To all other officers thank you for your contributions through the season, I apologise but there are too many of you to name. Your work behind the scenes is invaluable and makes our club a standard bearer in Surf Life Saving.

It was again another quiet year for Marcoola on the competition front with the shining light being Lily Rice coming 6<sup>th</sup> in Under 14 Beach Flags at the Aussie Youth Championships. Our surfboat crews were also active again with a Reserve Grade, Under 19 and women's crew representing the club during the year. A stellar effort from all involved and a special mention to Stephen DeLaurence for the program he has developed over the last three years. There were some great results which I will leave for the Boat Captain in his report, but we look forward to an exciting future.

Once again, we had a team and individuals in the Champion Lifesaver competition who performed to a very high standard. It is very heartening to see our young members embracing this competition and look forward to seeing this aspect of competition grow within the club.

As with any club, there is a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes and I would like to thank the committee members for their efforts in keeping the club running smoothly. I cannot mention everyone, but a lot has been achieved this year and has put the club in a very sound position going forward.

There have been some changes in the background with the biggest being the passing of a new Club Constitution and By Laws. These changes which are already in place will be more readily seen when the new Board is elected for the first time under the new constitution. The club redevelopment is under way with a lot of planning going on behind the scenes. The most significant to date being the lodgement of the BBRF grant application. I would like to thank the steering committee who were meeting weekly for some time and especially Debby Mulheran for the time and effort she put into writing the funding application. If we are successful, it will be largely due to your efforts.

To our sponsors big and small thank you for your contributions which are greatly appreciated and in no small way helps assist the club in purchasing and maintaining our gear and equipment. I look forward to a long and fruitful relationship as our no longer "small community" continues to grow. A special thanks to our major sponsors:

Despite Covid 19 the Supporters Club has managed to contribute more than was budgeted and because of this we are in a very sound position going forward.

Another big change this year was the appointment of Drew Palmer as General Manager to oversee all operations. Thank you Drew for the work you have done to ensure everything runs smoothly and better aligns with our goal of providing a gold standard Surf Life Saving Club. With your efforts we look forward to growing the club for our members and more importantly providing a safe swimming environment for the general public.

To Amanda and Lyn (so much for retirement) thank you for all your work through the year. It has not been easy with a large increase in paperwork due to the growth of Nippers and the increased number of SRC and Bronze course members. It is not only paperwork but all the associated things that have to happen to make the club run smoothly. It is a credit to you both how the club has functioned over the last year especially with the growth in members.

It was with a tinge of sadness that Warren, who has been cleaning downstairs for as long as I can remember, informed us that due to ill health he would no longer be able to continue in this role. We wish Warren all the best and look forward to seeing him upstairs for a beer from time to time.

Lastly thanks to my wife Lyn who puts up with my time spent at the club for the numerous meetings that I must attend.

To wrap up it has been a big year with an exciting time for the club coming up in the next few years especially with it looking like we will have 12 patrol teams next season. As we continue to grow it is also very important that we do not forget where we have come from and maintain our friendly family orientated club.



From the General Manager - Drew Palmer

Since taking on the role in August last year I am pleased with the current operations and successful outcomes of a number of projects that we've undertaken. My focus for the first few months was to ensure that we had the right process, procedures and policies in place and to work our way through the Covid 19 restrictions. Dealing with the constant change has been challenging, although this has ensured that we remain agile and ready to deal with new challenges and regulations as they are introduced.

Pleasingly we have ticked quite a few boxes from a strategic and governance perspective including:

- Revision and implementation of the new Surf Life Saving Club Constitution and By-Laws
- Development of our Strategic Plan 20/23 which provides clear direction on where we're headed
- IT upgrade to ensure that our data and communications are protected and stored in a safe environment.
- Development of a new sponsorship package

A major focus has been on the commencement of the Building Upgrade Project. A significant piece of work was undertaken to develop an application for a grant through the Federal Governments Building Better Regions Fund. All criteria was addressed with a comprehensive package being delivered. The 4 main areas of assessment include:

- Economic Benefits of the project for the region
- Social Benefits of the project for the region
- Capacity, capability and resources to deliver the project
- Impact of funding on region

Within these criteria a wide range of information and data has been provided to ensure that we can continue to provide life saving services for the next 20 to 30 years from a modern and fit for purpose facility. Acknowledgement to the Steering Committee and especially to Debby Mulheran for delivering such a comprehensive submission. Work now continues on the planning elements including environmental, parking and engineering assessments required to lodge our Development Application with Sunshine Coast Council. With this in mind, our goal is to now balance the building and maintenance aspects of the premises until we have an outcome and clear direction on the upgrade project.

A number of smaller projects have been delivered to ensure club facilities are enhanced and maintained including:

- New reception desk and sign in system to welcome members and guests,
- Upgraded female toilets in the Supporters Club,
- Stabilisation of the deck above the board storage area to ensure safety,
- Privacy walls fitted to gaming room entrances, and
- Introduction of Surf Cameras on the Tower.

Our support for community-based programs continues to assist the club and member activities delivering on our mission of being the peak body leading the way in life saving service provision, education, sport, beach and water safety advocacy and community leadership. The growth experienced across all areas of the Surf Club has also ensured we were able to support the following programs:

- A very successful Surf Education program for local schools and child care centres,
- Support and provision of services for QUESST (Queensland Emergency Services Surf Team) who now call us their Sunshine Coast home,
- Marcus Mission Men's support group providing vital mental health services, and
- A meeting place for local community groups, footy teams, fishing groups and more.

My focus is now ensuring that the next twelve months continues to deliver on the club's growth and ongoing development. Thanks to the entire team for your efforts and support to deliver the fantastic results we've achieved through 20/21.



From the Secretary - Lyn Mathison

The 2020-21 season was certainly challenging with Covid rules and regulations changing on a regular basis but we still managed to get through all of our commitments even if on a scaled down basis.

#### From the Treasurer - Craig Hunter-Smith

Our financial year from May 2020 to April 2021 delivered some stressful periods as well as some truly inspirational times as we negotiated our way through the challenges and restrictions of COVID-19. Pleasingly, the club fared well through this period by managing costs and maximising opportunities where possible.

With all things considered we have had a remarkable year with the Supporters Club transferring a total of \$450,000 in cash transfers during the year to enable the Surf Club to continue their operations on the beach. With our operations closed in May and June and limited in July and August this result is very impressive. Thanks to the management and staff who contributed to this success.

Overall income was up from the previous year by \$300,000. The major contribution was an additional \$165,000 from the Supporters Club, \$55,000 in various grants and \$35,000 in JobKeeper assistance from the government. All these areas, combined with control on expenses delivered an operating surplus of \$269,000, which was a tremendous result based on the trading conditions.

We would also like to acknowledge the vital contribution made by our key sponsors including Yaroomba Beach, Austraffic and North Shore Realty plus the many other partners who provide valuable income to support the crucial services provided by the club.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the Administration team of Lyn and Amanda for their dedication ad professionalism within their roles overseeing the day-to-day operations. I would also like to thank the Management Committee and officers, who under the leadership of Peter Hourn, provide countless hours of work for the club. Thanks also to the management and staff of the Supporters Club who have continued to deliver fantastic results.

We are heading into some very exciting times over the coming years with the proposed upgrade of the club. Financially we're in a strong position and I look forward to progressing our plans based on the outcome of our Building Better Regions Fund grant application which we anticipate will provide 50% of the funding required to complete these works. Stay tuned for regular updates in this space.

Finally, thanks to all our members for their continued commitment to the club this year. We perform a vital service for the local community and everyone's contributions are important in helping us to achieve our goals.

We look forward to seeing you all back next season.





## From the Junior Activities Chair – Amanda Janssen

Wow! Wow! What an incredible season 2020/21 was for our Nippers, with so many unbelievable highlights to recount. The goal of our Junior Activities program remains quite simple:

## "To deliver a quality lifesaving program for all members with a focus on surf awareness, surf safety & improved surf skills with an emphasis on FUN."

Despite the challenges that Covid presented in relation to program delivery, I think it is safe to say we not only achieved our goal we absolutely "annihilated it"!

In penning this report, I do hope that I am able to portray my sincere appreciation to all contributors, celebrate our incredible Nippers & do justice to the enormous successes we have experienced this season. So here goes...

## Our Seasons Highlights:

- A record breaking 214 Nippers enrolled, resulting in a 16% increase in participation numbers, making that a 73% increase in the past four seasons. It was the first season in Marcoola SLSC history that we had to cap our program numbers; we even had a substantial wait list of potential nippers busting to get in!
- Increased focus on teaching Surf Education, resulting in better educated and informed Nippers equipped to respond to situations.
- An impressive 74% of Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallions (new Surf Lifesavers) trained this season had a direct link to our Nipper Program, meaning they were either Nippers progressing through the ranks, or parents answering my pleas for assistance. Many of these incredible individuals have joined our patrol teams and assisted in not only keeping our Nippers safe on Sunday's but also the Marcoola bathing public. An incredible result!
- Acquisition of dedicated funding through sponsorship allowing us to purchase much needed new equipment to meet the demand of our program.
- Increased opportunities for training & skill development through the employment of a Swim Coach and Surf Rescue Coach.
- Increased leadership opportunities for our under-fourteens through the continuation of Nipper Leadership Program & integration into the Youth Program.
- Introduction of a Recycling Fundraising Program, meaning we are not only doing our bit for the environment but also raising funds for new gear & equipment.
- Instilled a strong sense of community and "place of belonging" for many of our Nippers and their Families.

## The Sunday 'Engine Room':

With the increase in participation numbers, it now takes around 50 volunteers to make our Sunday Nipper Program happen, week in week out – it really is a massive feat! I am so thankful for each & every one of these volunteers that work tirelessly to deliver such a quality surf education program to our Marcoola Nippers. 

Thanks again to the Australia Day committee as the Marcoola Rocks function again proved to be a resounding success. The event is a major attraction and hopefully with the support of our local community will continue to build on this success.

Gaming has seen a good increase in revenue and the Marcoola club continues to be rated highly within our region. Four new machines were purchased during the year and together with the upgrade of various games, the returns are proving to be best performance. Bistro 103 is regarded as one of the best dining options in our extended community providing quality food at good prices. The quality and presentation of the food is outstanding and congratulations must go to Kym and now Zane and his team. The front of house continues to get excellent reports on their friendly and efficient service. The bar continues to be the focal point of the club and the staff are always excellent in their service delivery. As mentioned, I expect that our family friendly service at the Marcoola Surf Club will continue to underpin our success.

I would like to thank the committee for the giving of their time over the past year. The committee comprise long standing members Peter Hourn, Rob McGregor, Peter Ward, Ian Hunter, Brian Goulding and Corey Janssen. The meetings have always been congenial and progressive and it is important that we continue to look over the horizon as we develop our club to meet the community needs.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the major sponsors of the Supporters Club who with their generosity make donations for the benefit of our Surf Club and support and sponsor our club and all events. We truly appreciate your financial support and without your dedication and support our club could not be where it is today. Thanks to all our business partners and sponsors.

Finally, thanks to all the patrons who have supported the club over the past year. We hope that you continue to support the Marcoola Surf Club as we intend to continue to provide the same efficient and friendly service for many years to come.

From the committee, management and staff we look forward to seeing you at the club during the upcoming year.

## From the Supporters Club Treasurer - Rob McGregor

The Marcoola Surf Club (Supporters Club) had a successful year considering the restrictions placed on trading since the lockdown from March 2020 to early June 2020.

Total operating profits made to Surf Lifesaving was \$539k, up from \$306k in the previous year – a solid result given trading limitations.

The club was fully closed when this financial year started (1<sup>st</sup> May) and reopened with very strict crowd and other restrictions in early June. These restrictions were eventually relaxed, but it is important to highlight that we are still operating with crowd restrictions, which limit us from having larger events, including Marcoola Rocks which this year ran with reduced crowd numbers.

Given that, the following summarises key revenue areas:

- Bar Revenue was down \$125k (11%)
- Bistro Revenue was down \$116k (12%)
- Gaming Revenue was down \$31k (3%)

These are reasonable results, given the restrictions we are operating under.

We received around \$343k in Jobkeeper and cashflow boost from the ATO (these ceased at the end of September 2020), which helped us both keep most of our team employed during restricted trading conditions and allow us to finish with an improved profit for the year.

I would like to thank all our supporters club team members, and Drew Palmer, our new General Manager, who in a challenging year, has led the team well through challenging times and greatly assisted the committee.

Thanks also to our long-term Supporters Club President Craig Hunter-Smith for his wisdom and leadership.


